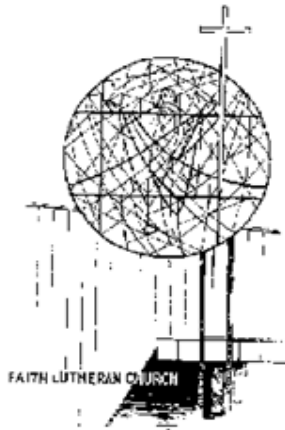

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"Happy New Year!" is what many people shout as the clock moves from 11:59 PM on Dec. 31 to 12:00 AM on Jan. 01. The commencement of a new year feels like a fresh start to many. Resolutions are made. New tasks are undertaken. Plans and goals are set. It marks a time of a fresh start.

When you were baptized, you received not only a fresh start, you were crucified with Christ and raised to new life in Christ. You died and were re-born in the death and resurrection of Christ. You did not simply get a "fresh start" nor did you simply get a "get out of hell free" card, as if baptism was your ticket in a theological *Monopoly* game. You received a New Life.

While I wish everyone a "Happy New Year," I also know what a hollow and finite sentiment that is. Instead of "Happy New Year," I wish you a year of **Blessed Baptismal New Beginnings**. I pray that you might find new opportunities, each and every day, to live and grow in the Spirit, via the covenant of your Baptism, in the name of the Father, and of the (+) Son, and of the Holy Spirit, ONE GOD. Many days, finding those moments or opportunities may be very small, but I invite you, in 2018, to be actively intentional in living in the blessing and covenant of Holy Baptism that you have received.

Holy Baptism is God's gift to you and for you. It is God's Word, action and promise for you. It is God's binding covenant with you that you are God's child. The gift of faith in God is imparted to you so that you may grow in the love and knowledge of God, nurtured in you through parents, godparents, pastors, Sunday school teachers, and many other people of faith in your life that God provides for you. God provides the gift and covenant for you. God gives the gift and promise to you. God nurtures you in faith to live in your baptismal covenant.

You do not *earn* God's grace by living every day in your baptismal covenant. God's gift is costly, but it is free. **Living actively and daily in the promises of your baptismal covenant is a faithful response to God's love and mercy upon you, at work in your life.**

In Christ, through regular confession, repentance, and forgiveness, we receive a fresh, clean start in Christ our Savior. Some may do this daily, if not multiple times daily, in our prayers with God. Others may engage in this radical act only on Sunday mornings, during "Confession and Forgiveness" at the beginning of every time of worship. I say "radical" since this action of confession reminds us of our need for God and the gift God gives us in Christ our Lord. I say "radical" since the action of repentance asks God to forgive us and re-form us into persons who live **Christ-centered** lives. I say "radical" since God's actions for us are radical: God gave His Only Son for us, to die and pay the price for our Sin and our sins. We even state it in the Nicene Creed: "For us and for our salvation [Christ] came down from heaven. . . For our sake he was crucified, . . . suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures." If that is not radical action and radical love, I do not know what is. Emmanuel, God with us, laid down his life for you.

You have God's radical love upon you. The Holy Spirit of God is with you. **You have been marked with the cross of (+) Christ forever, and you are claimed, gathered and sent for the sake of the world.** How do you embrace this commitment to live into **Blessed Baptismal New Beginnings**? I invite you to look at Luther's Small Catechism and the section on "The Sacrament of Holy Baptism (you may or should have a copy at home, but if not, look in the back of the red ELW hymnal at church, pp. 1164-65) and look up the order for Holy Baptism in the front of the hymnal. I invite you to study these things and read your Bible and find how God is calling **you** to live every day in **Blessed Baptismal New Beginnings**.

Happy New Year, People of God, and may each day call you into opportunities of **Blessed Baptismal New (Renewed) Beginnings in Christ**, your Lord and Savior.

CHANGE OF DIRECTION

Caring Bridge Journal entry by Jennifer Wegter-McNelly — December 20, 2017

I hit another bump in the road this month. Though eight months of chemo and immunological treatment has made a lot of progress on the original cancer sites, a scan revealed a new cancer site in another location. That was not good news, but we were quickly introduced to new doctors who are connected to the original team at Dana Farber. I had a focused radiation treatment (SRS) a couple of weeks ago, with no significant side effects. The radiation oncologist was confident that it would be effective on the new site for the time being.

My treatment and schedule have changed with this news. I get a break from weekly chemotherapy (yay! Goodbye, toxic Taxol.) Instead, I'll continue the trial drug and the infusion of immunologicals once every three weeks. That means traveling to Boston two or three times a month for treatment and scans, a big improvement over the weekly trips of the last nine months. Some of the side effects has also eased with the treatment change. I continue to be incredibly grateful to the medical care I am getting and have no niggling doubts that I am not in the right place or working with the right doctors for me.

In other news of the season, Kirk, Keller, and I are taking advantage of me not serving a congregation right now to go visit relatives in Minnesota over the holidays. We'll spend Christmas and days following with my big extended family, see our friends Mary and Jane, and have a couple of days with Kirk's brother Todd, Julie, and Oma Diane. The grand finale will be my cousin Paige's New Year's Eve wedding to her sweetie Shane. It will be a busy and festive time with a bunch of people we care about before we fly home just in time for Kirk and Keller to drop back into school on January 2.

I always seem to end these updates with the same thought, but sometimes the truth is consistent. We remain very grateful for the many wonderful people in our lives; for love, support, and many moments of joy; for good books, gifts of hot dish, and thoughtful letters and cards; and for the therapy of Stress Baking, a lovely and buttery way to indulge Stress Eating.
