

CALL PROCESS

The joint Pastoral Discernment Committee, consisting of members from both of our Parish congregations, completed their work at a meeting at ELC-Poestenkill on June 13. The committee concluded that what each congregation wants and needs in a new Pastor is similar and compatible, which is important since we will be making this new call jointly. On June 20 Ruth Frazee, President ELCP, Pastor Slater, Pastor Jo Page, our Conference Dean, and I met to discuss our next steps in the call process.


A document called a Ministry Site Profile that describes our Parish – the two congregations – must be completed for Synod. Between the membership surveys and analysis conducted last year (CAT and COW) and the work of the Pastoral Discernment Committee, the background work for completing significant sections of the Profile is available. The Faith and ELCP councils now must work together on a revised Covenant Agreement that spells out how the Parish will share and support our new Pastor. In addition, there is information relating to community demographics, membership, attendance and budget that must be reported.

Once these tasks have been completed, and approved by the two councils, we will have a special congregational meeting where the congregation will consider what is being proposed and take action on it. Our intent is to keep you posted on progress through the newsletter and to have an informational meeting the week before the actual congregational meeting to provide the opportunity for discussion prior to voting on the measures.

Personal describes how a candidate relates to individuals of varying ages and groups.

Leadership describes qualities relating to innovative approaches, communication skills, inter-congregational and synod relationships.

Social describes qualities relating to individual and community connections.

Faith describes qualities that would bolster and encourage faith in action.

Note: It is assumed that candidates will possess required education and training and be ordained.

COUNCIL SUMMARY

Preliminary discussions have occurred between Faith and Evangelical to outline a schedule and strategy to prepare the Ministry Site Survey. This will be used by Synod to initiate the call process for a new pastor.

Additional desirable traits for the new pastor were identified and communicated to the Discernment Committee. These include continuation of ecumenical activities and able to reach out to the elderly and homebound.

A motion was made and approved to appoint members to the Parish Council. The Parish Council will be comprised of 3 members plus the treasurer of both Faith and Evangelical. The first task will be to work with Evangelical to review and update our joint agreement.
