Here's a Quiz Question for you, in the category of Arcane Christian Calendar Trivia:

How long is Easter?

If you answered **24 hours**, well, yes, technically that is correct. Easter is the same length as all the other days of the year.

But if your answer was **50 days** or **7 Sundays**, you can also give yourself a point. In the Christian tradition, we are encouraged to celebrate the resurrection not only on Easter morning but for the following season, often called Eastertide.

This is great news for those of you who love hymns and music because it gives us a whole lot longer to enjoy all the great music that we couldn't possibly fit into a single day.

For a preacher, it is a bit more of a puzzle. How do we think about resurrection for seven Sundays, I wondered when I was a new preacher?

The first thing to notice is that the good news of the resurrection didn't happen at the same time for everybody. Remember, Mary Magdalene met the risen Jesus at the tomb, but the disciples in the locked room didn't meet him until later. And the disciple Thomas until after that. And the disciples on the road to Cana later still. The experience of the resurrection and the joyful news rippled out, bit by bit over time.

Another reason it is important to enjoy the whole season of Eastertide is because there are so many ways to think about the resurrection power of Jesus Christ rippling out in our lives.

Here are a few of my favorites. (You might consider these for your prayers or reflection in the coming weeks. I'm also eager to hear what other ways you may be thinking about resurrection.)

We can pray for insight and commitment so that we may be good stewards of the planet, in our individual choices and as a people.

Resurrection in our relationships – I don't know anyone who doesn't have at least one relationship that could use a little resurrection hope. Think of the people who are important in your life – either because you love them or because you are connected in an important way. Explore what resurrection might look like in that relationship. Is it forgiveness? Speaking the truth in love? Letting go and moving on? Often it is only with God's help that we can discover the right thing to do in a difficult relationship.

Resurrection in our congregation – As your Interim Pastor, I fear you will tire of me reminding you of this, but it is always the right time to wonder and pray about how God may be bringing new life, people, or possibilities to our church. Where does our great joy meet the world's (or the neighborhood's) deep need?

Resurrection of justice between people – There are so many ways we might focus our prayers for Christ's newness between people locally and internationally. One that has been close to my heart lately has been prayers for the dynamic between police officers and citizens in our area. I am troubled and concerned by the spiral of disrespect, abuse, and violence. How can God help us create the trust needed so that the police treat the citizens with dignity and fairness, and the people treat the police with respect and support?

May God bless us and refresh us as ripples of resurrection newness spread through our lives this season.

COUNCIL SUMMARY

There was further discussion regarding the need for an Office Oversight and Administration Committee to be responsible for addressing administrative and technical requirements of the church. A motion was made and approved by members of the Council to add the Office Oversight and Administration Committee to the Faith Constitution. Rob Hayward will serve as chairman.

Conversations with members of Faith and Evangelical regarding the search for a new pastor will continue. Pastor Jennifer is initially coordinating a meeting of Faith committee members and then will schedule a joint meeting with all Call Process Committee members.

An updated Faith Constitution needs to be submitted to Synod in 2018. A comparison of a model Synod Constitution with Faith's Constitution is being performed to identify how much work will be required to update.
