

Dear friends,

For as much as I love October and its colors, flavors, and temperatures, I don't really have those same happy feeling about November! There's a sharper feel to some of the changes we notice now – less daylight and colder temperatures, and also a dulling of the contrasts outdoors – bright colors replaced by more brown and gray. I am apt to notice the light in November also. Once the leaves come off the trees, the brighter light of the sun is more revealing – a bit more intense, maybe.

I think that this mixes and matches well with what we are experiencing during this season of the church year also. The 'season' of November (unofficial, but still noteworthy!) is one of somewhat harsher light on the truth of our mortality. The first Sunday of the month is All Saints' Sunday (falling this year on All Saints' Day – November 1st!) – a day to honor and give thanks for the lives of those we knew and loved – those who now rest in the bright light of God's presence. The next two Sundays take up what we call 'the end times' – a challenging period of transition before we reach – and celebrate – the Reign of Christ on Christ the King Sunday – November 22.

We get to add a fifth Sunday to this month – which will usher in the beloved season of Advent – and the lovely shade of blue and waiting . . .

WELCOME BACK!


With respect to our indoor worship and in-person, we want to remind you of a couple things:

- PLEASE do a quick health screening before you come to church. If you are feeling ill at all, do not leave your home. Attend our worship service via Zoom at 10:30 a.m.
- Bring your mask – and wear it over your mouth and nose! Everyone attending worship in-person must wear a mask.

When you arrive at church, enter the narthex through the east or west doors. Keep six feet between you and others.

Provide your name and phone number to the check-in person. This is for contact tracing. We also ask you to sanitize your hands.

Move towards the center aisle, take a bulletin from the table, place your offering in the plate (THANK YOU!), and allow the usher to help you find a seat.



Stay seated during the entire worship service. At the end of the service, exit through the doors at the front of the sanctuary.

If you need to use the restroom during the service, please follow the arrows. Only one person/ family at a time should be in the restroom.

Currently we will not be singing during in-person worship or offering Holy Communion. We also cannot provide a coffee hour following worship.

RE-OPENING 'JOBS'

As we gather again inside and in-person this Fall, a few volunteers are needed to insure our safety and comfort:

- Check-in – two people sit at the check-in table to verify names and phone numbers for everyone attending

STAPLE FOOD SUGGESTIONS TO
SHOP FOR OR DONATE – **ELCP Poestenkill, NY**

Meat Items: hamburger (1lb.) bacon (1lb.) hot dogs, frozen chicken (tenders, nuggets, patties) Frozen fish (sticks, fillets) Eggs, American cheese slices, butter (1 lb.), bread & rolls
Canned or jarred items: Vegetables (green beans, corn, peas, potatoes, beets, carrots) Fruit (peaches, pears, pineapple, **fruit cocktail, Mandarin oranges**, applesauce)
Pork & Beans, any like Bush’s baked beans, canned pasta (ravioli, beef-a-roni, spaghetti)

IN-PERSON, INDOOR WORSHIP!

Going forward the indoor/ in-person worship service will alternate between Evangelical and Faith Lutheran, each week at 9:00 a.m., AND the 10:30 Zoom worship would continue to be offered.

If you would like to receive OR continue to receive a weekly mailing of the Zoom worship bulletin, please call the church office (518 237 4641) and leave a message with your name and plan to continue. Thank you!

Here are some of the guidelines for our in-person worship:

- **Please, please do not come to in-person worship if you feel ill!** The symptoms of the virus are well-known – fever, shortness of breath, and achiness. Especially as we move into the Fall and flu season, we all need to be careful about spreading any illness to others when we are together.
- If you come to in-person worship, **a mask will be required.** That mask should cover your nose and mouth fairly snugly. Please have it on when you enter the building. Masks will also be available at the check-in table.
- Upon entering, you will be asked to sanitize your hands.
- We will ask you to verify your name and phone number for tracking purposes should someone present that day develop COVID-19.
- We ask that you **remain at least 6 feet away from others.** That includes when you are entering or leaving – and when you are sitting. The pews in the sanctuary will be marked to indicate where you can sit. Those from the same household can sit together.
- Please enter through the narthex – either the east or west doors. An usher will assist you in via the center aisle to a pew. All exiting will be from the side aisles and through the doors at the front of the sanctuary – near the library and the sacristy.
- An offering plate will be available in the center aisle for your envelope. THANK YOU!
- A bulletin will be available for use during the service.
- If you need to use the restroom while you are in the building, please allow only one person in the room at a time. Use the disinfectant wipes that are available.

Initially we will not be singing hymns or partaking in Holy Communion. These additions to our service may be added as we move forward.
