At the October meeting of the Council, Dakota Franklin gave a presentation to the Council about his Eagle Scout project, which would result in a Meditation / Memory Garden Area on our property near the creek & playground. Other reports included a proposal for repair of windows, our annex property, and a meeting with representatives of Evangelical, Poestenkill that included some discussion of the financial future of both of our congregations. The schedule of services for the holidays was approved. Faith will host the shared Thanksgiving service with Transfiguration Parish on Wednesday, Nov. 21st at 7pm. Donations of canned food or money from that service will be given to our local food pantries. The Sunday School is planning a short presentation for the congregation at worship service on December 16th. Stewardship activities are being organized for this fall, which will conclude on Dec. 16th. As usual, an update was provided on the various property committee projects.
