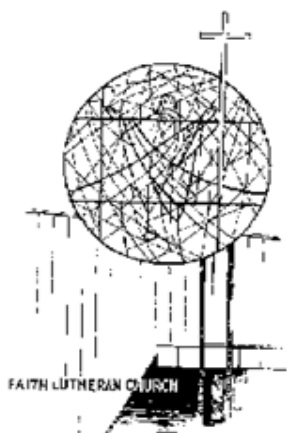

By now, most of you know, I have been diagnosed with esophageal cancer. Believe me; no one was more shocked than I was to receive such news. First realized in mid July, I can tell you with no uncertainty, such information takes a while to digest. So many of you can relate, as you too have received an unwelcome diagnosis; or known someone close to you who has. You, too, know that we eventually gather ourselves up, put ourselves into the Lord's hands, seek help, and move forward come what may. I am no different. Therefore, I will share with you what I know to expect thus far and plan to do. My cancer is somewhat difficult, but treatable. Treatment will entail the administration of chemo and radiation combined for a six week period. Following a time to rebuild my strength, I will be scheduled for surgery. There will be about a six week recovery period following surgery. Needless to say, the churches will require ministerial help from "pastoral types" other than me during that recovery time. Rest assured, you will be in good hands... as I too, expect to be in good hands.

Times like these cannot help but become a version of what I would call a *wakeup call*. In my

Believe me, I know first-hand how difficult it can be to want to say the right word or do the right thing. Even pastors worry about such matters. Such concerns can make it difficult to say or do anything at all. Please, just be yourself. I plan to be myself, so you do the same. Be yourself, no more, no less. I promise; we'll do just fine. Beyond that, I ask for your prayers. We can rely on prayer to change our attitudes as well as the perspective of the ones we're praying for. Certainly, remember all the sick and recuperating, yet please don't forget those to whom they are so closely related. Sometime we forget the anxieties of those who are connected to people like me. If you would, remember my family and all such families?

In closing, I'll repeat what I said that Sunday late in July when I shared my predicament, "I count it a great privilege to serve as your pastor and experience your beautiful witness. Let us continue to be good troopers in the Lord.... and keep smiling!" After all, smiles make for pretty good medicine.

The dishwasher in the kitchen is to be removed.

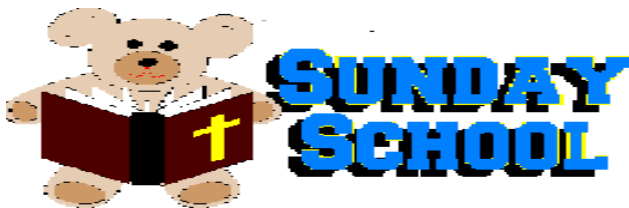
We are considering placing bins and/or boxes in the kitchen for recycling.
