


Following Faith APRIL 2021





Dear friends,

Even as these past few days have given us hints of warmer and brighter days ahead, our church calendar is now drawing us into the most holy week of the church year. On the last Sunday of March we'll come to the Sunday which carries two distinct moods. Palm Sunday is a time to celebrate – as Jesus rides into Jerusalem to the cheers and praises of the local people. But within the week (for him) and within the hour (for us), we know that Jesus is arrested and put to death on the cross.

Two services during Holy Week will look closer at the events of the week. The first is on Thursday – Maundy Thursday – when we hear about Jesus' last meal with his close friends – his disciples. On Friday – Good Friday – we walk the last few hours of Jesus life with him – to his death on Friday afternoon. Both the Thursday and Friday evening services will be at 7:00 on Zoom. Look for bulletins for these services in the way that you usually receive the bulletin each week.

On Easter Sunday – the Resurrection of Our Lord – there will be three opportunities to worship and celebrate this most holy of all days!

8:30 a.m. – Easter worship – Holy Communion Evangelical Lutheran parking lot

10:30 a.m. – Easter worship - Holy Communion Faith Lutheran parking lot

You are welcome to attend the outdoor parking lot services remaining in your car and tuning your car radio to the FM station that we'll use. If the weather is nice, you could bring a lawn chair and sit

COUNCIL

President's Report:

Donna St. John reported that she and Eugene visited the St. John cemetery site in Melrose and found that it was very overgrown. Photos were shared with Council. In regard to the St. John's Cemetery, Pastor attached a report by Steve Converse who recommended that a task force be appointed investigate further and possibly work on the property.

Pastor's Report

Confirmation class continues via Zoom. Pastor will spend time with each student and is planning an Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation) service on May 23rd.

Lenten adult study continues with sessions at 9:30 AM and 7:30 PM every Wednesday.

Committee Reports

Property – (Errol Bull, Bill Jarosz) –

Doors: New locks are needed for the kitchen and boiler room doors at a cost of \$125/set. The east and west Narthex entrance doors need to be replaced with new doors equipped with panic hardware. Bill Jarosz will research parking lot repair costs. Errol Bull will get estimates for annex roof repairs.

Partnership Council (Carol Karpien, Roberta Hayward, Bill Jarosz, Donna Van Zandt)

The Partnership Council met on March 2 with Synod representatives Jo Page and Julie Grindle. They presented two options for the call process: 1. Begin call process right away. 2. Get a transition pastor for 12 to 18 months with the option to call the transition pastor. Option 2 was the recommended choice as it would give the churches more time to assess their situations.

Additionally, Gilead Lutheran has expressed interest in some type of joint ministry, which would take time to investigate. A question was raised whether we would have the opportunity to interview a transitional pastor. The understanding was that we would. Council agreed that option 2 was the better approach.
