Second Quarter Stewardship Summary

During the second quarter, Faith has received \$17,266 in collections. This reflects an increase of \$661 when compared to the same period last year.

While this is a positive indicator, we must be aware of several factors affecting the church's financial well-being. First, over the last three year period, member contributions have declined by 7.4 %. Second, last year the church benefited from receiving a loan of \$23,500 from the Small Business Administration PPP that was later forgiven. This loan helped us weather the negative effects of the pandemic, but was a onetime opportunity. With these two factors in mind, it is most important that we continue to give generously and build on the progress we have made. Please prayerfully consider how together we may accomplish this.
