

On Wednesday, February 14, 2018, we enter the season of LENT. It is Ash Wednesday. During the Lenten season, how might we re-focus our life, our time, and our energy in ways that help us live out our baptismal gifts and promises?

A labyrinth for your use is printed and included in this newsletter. A labyrinth is not a maze.

A labyrinth has only one continuous path to the center and back out again.

The entrance the labyrinth is at the bottom, at "6 o'clock."

Ancient Roots: Prayer Labyrinth

For centuries, the labyrinth has been found in religious traditions around the world.

The "Wholeness Wheel Labyrinth" printed on the next page, on the other side of this page, follows the labyrinth pattern in the 13th century floor of Chartres Cathedral in France.

Directly below are the directions to engage in this spiritual discipline.

May the practice of praying your way through the wholeness wheel labyrinth be a blessing and a <u>part</u> of your Lenten spiritual discipline.

Pray the Wholeness Wheel Labyrinth daily.

- Sit comfortably in a quiet place.
- Place your finger at the entrance to the labyrinth.
- Trace your finger slowly along the path.
- Rest in the center.
- Return *slowly* on the same path.

CALL PROCESS MINISTRY SITE PROFILE UPDATE

As of this writing our Ministry Site Profile (MSP), and Evangelical's Ministry Site Profile, have been accepted by the ELCA to Upstate NY Synod. A potential candidate for Pastor will soon be recommended to our joint (Faith and Evangelical) call committee and they will begin their vetting process.

The MSP process has been a lengthy one. While there has been material related to its preparation in earlier newsletters, I know that it is difficult to understand just how the process is working. The bottom line is that we have prepared a profile of our ministries, our communities, our financial position and our hopes for our church's future that will be given to a candidate to help him or her understand who we are. Synod will use this information to match us with a person whose goals are compatible with ours.

Below is an MSP section taken from what has been prepared, approved, and submitted. Please read it carefully and think about how you can be part of this process. The second section describes what we have said that we will do as a congregation to help the new Pastor settle in and begin leading us into our future.

Mutual Expectations

Please list the five primary areas of activity or focus that you wish your newly-called rostered leader to give special attention to during the first year of his or her ministry at this congregation:

- A. Settling in to the new community, new home, and new congregations. Becoming familiar with our communities.
- B. Ministering to our existing membership. Spending time meeting with and calling on congregants to get to know us individually and corporately.
- C. Following existing routines and service format, take stock of who we are. Begin thinking of ways that the existing programs may be changed for the better to minister effectively to both existing and potential future members.
- D. As the year progresses, establish a general schedule and time allocations that realistically address what one person serving two separate congregations can actually do. Work with the Covenant Council to involve lay participation to better cover areas of ministry that need additional attention.
- E. Work with the Covenant Council and individual congregational councils to develop plans and goals for the future of the two congregations bound by our Covenant Agreement.

Please list 5 ways that this congregation will support and encourage the rostered leader during the first year in order to help him or her accomplish these responsibilities:

- A. We will take affirmative steps to make sure that the new Pastor is shown around the new community and introduced to community contacts who may be important in fulfilling his/her new role.
- B. We will set up opportunities for the Pastor to meet the congregation in informal settings and will provide support persons to accompany her/him on initial visits to shut ins and inactive members, if so desired.
- C. Provide opportunity for two-way feedback. On a monthly basis review with the Pastor the effectiveness of the support that is being provided. Communicate progress and needs to the congregation via monthly newsletter.
- D. Realizing that change is needed in order to continue our journey together into the future, work through and with the Covenant Council to embrace, support and try new and different ways of being God's people in our communities. Assist in enlisting lay support to actively engage in the change process and work towards the successful implementation of new ways and ideas.
- E. With the Pastor, prioritize what we need to do and can do vs what we wish for. Work together with the Pastor to accomplish the goals that are set. God Bless each and every one of you.

Council last met on January 8, 2018. The Council reviewed and approved the proposed budget for 2018.


