You probably have heard the name John Wooden. Wooden was the legendary college basketball coach who led UCLA to national prominence. Wooden was immensely successful as a college coach, posting ten national championships and setting numerous, numerous records in college basketball. Interestingly, Wooden never spoke about winning. He only spoke about elevating one's game, being prepared, and making the most of each day. If one could improve themselves for the day, he/she had won. His philosophy was simple. Begin with yourself, and the rest will take care of itself.

Known to maintain his composure in all circumstances, a reporter once asked him how he managed to keep his cool under such great pressure while coaching in the heat of a game. Instantly, Wooden simply reached into his pocket and took out a wooden cross.

When the pressure is on I hold this cross in my hand," he explained. "Not as a good luck charm. I just hold it there to remind me that there is something more important than basketball."

Interesting how certain symbols have a way of putting perspective back into our lives. How assuring it is that certain reminders can calm us and help us to think clearly and act mindfully. John Wooden is a wonderful reminder of reminders. There is One Thing that is more important than everything else. In the end, it's the only thing that matters. Because with it, there is no end!
