From the STAYING IN TOUCH

I appreciate an illustration Billy Graham once used. As he had recently watched the docking of the great liner United States as it arrived in New York harbor, he noted how the deck hands first received a long cable extending from the ship to the dock. Immediately, this cable was attached to an elaborate "reeling in" system driven by powerful motors. Of course as the cable shortened, the ship was eventually drawn snugly to the pier and all was secured. Commenting, he made special note of how the pier was not drawn to the ship, rather the ship drawn to the pier. He then pointed out that prayer is like that cable, that it pulls God and us together. But it doesn't pull God down to us; it pulls us to God. Thus, we learn from the One who taught us to pray, "Not my will; but Thine be done."

Perhaps the greatest thing about prayer is that it first and foremost draws us into the presence of God. Once aware of such close proximity, aware of a power above all powers, we discover the one thing necessary, and according to St. Paul, the one thing that really matters, "We have already been understood." What more can we ask for? And by the way, what was it we were asking for in the first place?
