

We're quickly approaching harvest season, and I'm looking forward to joining some of our farmers on their combines as they bring in the corn and soybeans. (I have also already received invitations to assist with calf and lamb birthing, come spring--we'll see.)

In the three weeks since I arrived, we have already had baptisms and funerals, the beginning of Sunday School and Confirmation classes, special council meetings, and more. It is an honor to join this community in all their joys and their sorrows, but know that I think of you all often and am so grateful for your prayers and support.
