

CALL PROCESS

A sub committed from our council has been working on completing this report using materials from our Congregational Assessment Tool Survey and the work of the Faith/Evangelical Discernment Committee. It is expected that each congregation will complete its Ministry Site Profile report, which must be submitted prior to initiating the call process, this month. While each congregation will submit its own profile, the profiles will be coordinated locally to ensure that they are consistent. Perhaps this will put us in a position to begin consideration of Pastoral Candidates shortly after the New Year.

CHURCHTRAC ONLINE SOFTWARE NOW AVAILABLE FOR USE

Faith Church Council has purchased a license for ChurchTrac software that will be used as a database for congregation members, Church teams and groups; maintaining an electronic calendar of church events; and other features to assist in the management of our Church.

Congregation members may access the ChurchTrac website at:

To sign in, each member will need to enter their email address and a passcode. The first time a member signs in they will need to click the area on the web page "I do not have a passcode". A unique passcode will be sent to the member's email address. The member may then return to the website and sign in using the passcode provided.

ChurchTrac allows members to view and edit their member profile information and information of other members in their household. In addition, members may view the online Faith Calendar and access a directory of Church members including addresses and phone numbers.

Members are encouraged to visit the website to ensure their profiles are correct and make updates as needed.
